- (1) Please notify the Chaplaincy Treasurer or Diocesan Finance Officer if you
(a) Wish to cancel this declaration; (b) Change your name or home address; (c) No longer pay sufficient tax on your Income and / or Capital Gains. Gift Aid is linked to basic rate tax: Basic rate tax is currently 20% which currently allows charities to reclaim 25% in the Pound.
- (2) Higher rate tax payers can claim back the difference between basic rate and higher rate or additional rate tax. If you pay Income Tax at the higher or additional rate and want to receive the additional tax relief due to you, you must include all your Gift Aid donations on your Self Assessment tax return or ask "HM Revenue & Customs" to adjust your tax code.
- (3) 95% of the reclaimable tax also benefits the Chaplaincy with 5% being deducted by the Diocese as an Administration Charge. For each £100 donated the Chaplaincy receives £23-75p in Reclaimable Tax and the Diocese £1-25p. NB: the Chaplaincy receives 100% of the donation.
