CALL TO WORSHIP

How awesome is this place! This is none other than the house of God, and this is the gate of heaven. (Genesis 28:17)

GLORIA IN EXCELSIS (All Stand)

Glory to God in the highest, and peace to his people on earth. Lord God, heavenly King, almighty God and Father, we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory. Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us; you are seated at the right hand of the Father: receive our prayer. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

THE MINISTRY OF THE WORD First Reading – Jeremiah 1: 4-10

- ⁴ The word of the Lord came to me, saying, ⁵ 'Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, before you were born I set you apart; I appointed you as a prophet to the nations.'
- 6 'Alas, Sovereign Lord,' I said, 'I do not know how to speak; I am too young.'
- ⁷ But the Lord said to me, 'Do not say, "I am too young." You must go to everyone I send you to and say whatever I command you. ⁸ Do not be afraid of them, for I am with you and will rescue you,' declares the Lord. ⁹ Then the Lord reached out his hand and touched my mouth and said to me, 'I have put my words in your mouth. ¹⁰ See, today I appoint you over nations and kingdoms to uproot and tear down, to destroy and overthrow, to build and to plant.'

This is the word of the Lord.

Psalm 71:1-6

- ¹ In you, Lord, I have taken refuge; let me never be put to shame.
- ² In your righteousness, rescue me and deliver me; turn your ear to me and save me.
- ³ Be my rock of refuge, to which I can always go; give the command to save me, for you are my rock and my fortress.
- ⁴ Deliver me, my God, from the hand of the wicked,

- from the grasp of those who are evil and cruel.
- ⁵ For you have been my hope, Sovereign Lord, my confidence since my youth.
- ⁶ From my birth I have relied on you; you brought me forth from my mother's womb. I will ever praise you.

Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit; as it was in the beginning is now and shall be for ever. Amen.

Second Reading - Hebrews 12: 18-29

¹⁸ You have not come to a mountain that can be touched and that is burning with fire; to darkness, gloom and storm; ¹⁹ to a trumpet blast or to such a voice speaking words that those who heard it begged that no further word be spoken to them, ²⁰ because they could not bear what was commanded: 'If even an animal touches the mountain, it must be stoned to death.' ²¹ The sight was so terrifying that Moses said, 'I am trembling with fear.'

²² But you have come to Mount Zion, to the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem. You have come to thousands upon thousands of angels in joyful assembly, ²³ to the church of the firstborn, whose names are written in heaven. You have come to God, the Judge of all, to the spirits of the righteous made perfect, ²⁴ to Jesus the mediator of a new covenant, and to the sprinkled blood that speaks a better word than the blood of Abel.

²⁵ See to it that you do not refuse him who speaks. If they did not escape when they refused him who warned them on earth, how much less will we, if we turn away from him who warns us from heaven? ²⁶ At that time his voice shook the earth, but now he has promised, 'Once more I will shake not only the earth but also the heavens.' ²⁷ The words 'once more' indicate the removing of what can be shaken – that is, created things – so that what cannot be shaken may remain.

²⁸ Therefore, since we are receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken, let us be thankful, and so worship God acceptably with reverence and awe, ²⁹ for our 'God is a consuming fire.'

This is the word of the Lord.

Hymn: 706 – We pray thee, heavenly Father

Gospel reading - Luke 13: 10-17

On a Sabbath Jesus was teaching in one of the synagogues, ¹¹ and a woman was there who had been crippled by a spirit for eighteen years. She was bent over and could not straighten up at all. ¹² When Jesus saw her, he called her forward and said to her, 'Woman, you are set free from your infirmity.' ¹³ Then he put his hands on her, and immediately she straightened up and praised God.

¹⁴ Indignant because Jesus had healed on the Sabbath, the synagogue leader said to the people, 'There are six days for work. So come and be healed on those days, not on the Sabbath.'

¹⁵ The Lord answered him, 'You hypocrites! Doesn't each of you on the Sabbath untie your ox or donkey from the stall and lead it out to give it water? ¹⁶ Then should not this woman, a daughter of Abraham, whom Satan has kept bound for eighteen long years, be set free on the Sabbath day from what bound her?'

¹⁷ When he said this, all his opponents were humiliated, but the people were delighted with all the wonderful things he was doing.
